**We will set your kitty up in the hospital with urine collection litter. If he/she has not urinated by early afternoon we can perform a Cystocentesis (\$26), whereby we gently extract urine with a needle and syringe. This often allows us to send your kitty home that day. With difficult cats this procedure may require sedation (\$40-45) or an Ultrasound guided Cystocentesis (\$44) as well.**

**In the event that you prefer that we do not perform the Cystocentesis or your cat's bladder is not full enough for the procedure, your kitty may stay in the hospital overnight (\$35.00) and give us a sample tomorrow morning.**

**Cats may have sediment, stones, or tumors in their bladders, causing them pain. If we suspect these, we perform an Ultrasound study on their bladders ( \$88) to visualize their bladder wall and its contents.**
